SHALOM: Christian Disciples Transforming the World Through Health and Wholeness

The beautiful meaning of the word *shalom* is sometimes underappreciated. Its usage can become limited to its basic definitions. From Israel's Jewish population to far stretches of the world, the definition of *shalom* is commonly associated with the word *peace*, or the absence of struggle or war. While this is certainly a correct way to use the word, the power of *shalom* runs much deeper.

Throughout the Bible, *shalom* has a complex set of meanings. It refers to: a satisfying rest and good health; a healthy harmony and balance; an authentic wholeness. When used this way, *shalom* is much more than a word we use for peace. It is a strong and idyllic way to relate to others and to ourselves. It is something we do. *Shalom* is helping our brothers and sisters who do not have enough or whose needs are not met. Once we have tried, or are trying, to right these wrongs through bringing others into abundance, we can say we are coming to *shalom*.



Let's celebrate the ways we continue to promote individual and communal health and wholeness. With God as our foundation, let us continue to bring ourselves and others to *shalom*.


