Charles Wesley, 1707-1788

The year 2007 marks the 300th anniversary of the birth of Charles Wesley. Aside from being the brother of John Wesley, Charles is best known for writing hundreds of hymns, a number of which are still well-known today. United Methodist favorites "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing," "And Are We Yet Alive," "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today," and even "Hark the Herald Angles Sing" are just a few to Wesley's credit. The moving words of many hymns—Wesley's and others'—make powerful prayers. One such hymn, "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling," is printed below.

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling Words: Charles Wesley, 1747

Love divine, all loves excelling, joy of heaven, to earth come down; fix in us thy humble dwelling; all thy faithful mercies crown! Jesus thou art all compassion, pure, unbounded love thou art; visit us with thy salvation; enter every trembling heart.

Breathe, O breathe thy loving Spirit into every troubled breast! Let us all in thee inherit; let us find that second rest. Take away our bent to sinning; Alpha and Omega be; end of faith, as its beginning, set our hearts at liberty.

Come, Almighty to deliver, let us all thy life receive; suddenly return and never, nevermore thy temples leave. Thee we would be always blessing, serve thee as thy hosts above, pray and praise thee without ceasing, glory in thy perfect love.

Finish, then, thy new creation; pure and spotless let us be. Let us see thy great salvation perfectly restored in thee; changed from glory into glory, till in heaven we take our place, till we cast our crowns before thee, lost in wonder, love, and praise.
